Accommodation establishments such as hotels, resorts, apartment hotels, and other accredited accommodation establishments; travel and tour services; meetings, incentives, conferences & events (MICE) venues or facilities; and restaurants inside hotels and resorts.

IATF RESOLUTION NO. 157

Beginning 16 February 2022, proof of full vaccination shall be made a requirement for entry of all foreign nationals allowed to enter the Philippines.

01

An individual shall be considered as having been fully vaccinated for COVID-19:

- a. More than or equal to 2 weeks after having received the second dose in a 2-dose series, or
- b. More than or equal to 2 weeks after having received a single-dose vaccine.
- c. The vaccines administered to the individual are included in any of the following:
 - i. Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) List or Compassionate Special Permit (CSP) issued by the Philippine Food and Drug Administration; or
 - ii. Emergency Use Listing of the World Health Organization.
- d. Foreign nationals must have the following proofs of vaccination against COVID-19 recognized under existing IATF regulations:
 - i. World Health Organization International Certificates of
 - ii. Vaccination and Prophylaxis; VaxCertPH; or
 - iii. National/state digital certificate of the foreign government which has accepted VaxCertPH under a reciprocal arrangement* unless otherwise permitted by the IATF.

Exceptions to the requirement that all passengers to be fully vaccinated and to provide proof of vaccination status prior to boarding an airplane/vessel to the Philippines

- a. Children below eighteen (18) years of age;
- b. People medically unable to receive the vaccine, as certified by a competent public health authority in the country/port of origin; and
- c. Foreign diplomats and their qualified dependents/9(e) visa holders.

The DOTr, through the Civil Aeronautics Board, is hereby instructed to mandate the airlines to require foreign nationals travelling to the Philippines to present proof of full vaccination prior to boarding flights to any points in the Philippines.
