



## Travel Requirements to the Philippines From 01 April 2022 Onwards

### *Entry Requirements*

Beginning Friday, 01 April 2022, tourists may enter the Philippines without need of an Entry Exemption Document, provided that they:

1. Comply with applicable visa requirements (e.g. possession of a valid 9A visa);
2. Are fully vaccinated, except for minors **below twelve (12) years of age** traveling with their vaccinated foreign parents;
3. Carry/possess an acceptable proof of vaccination;
4. Present a **negative** RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (48) hours or a negative laboratory-based Antigen Test taken within twenty-four (24) hours, prior to the date and time of departure from the country of origin/first port of embarkation in a continuous travel to the Philippines, excluding lay-overs;
5. Have passports valid for a period of at least six (6) months at the time of their arrival to the Philippines; and
6. Obtain, prior to arrival, a travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment costs from reputable insurance providers, with a minimum coverage of USD35,000.00 for the duration of their stay in the Philippines.

### *Visa Requirements*

The following are the minimum requirements for each visa type. The MECO Visa Officer has the right to ask for any additional documents that may be deemed necessary.

- I. **Single-Entry Individual Visa** – valid for three (3) months from date of issue and provide for a maximum stay of fifty-nine (59) days in the Philippines.

- II. **Multiple-Entry Individual Visa** - valid for three (3) months, six (6) months, or one (1) year from date of issue and provide for a maximum stay of fifty-nine (59) days in the Philippines.

III. **Transit Visa** – valid for one month and allow for a maximum duration of stay of seventy-two (72) hours

**Frequently Asked Questions  
On the Entry Requirements to the Philippines  
Under IATF Resolution No. 165**

**Q: What are the requirements for travel to the Philippines beginning 01 April 2022?**

*A: Beginning 0001H, 01 April 2022, tourists may enter the Philippines without an Entry Exemption Document, provided that they:*

1. *Comply with applicable visa requirements (e.g. possession of a valid 9A visa);*
2. *Are fully vaccinated, except only for minors **below twelve (12) years of age** traveling with their vaccinated foreign parents;*
3. *Carry/possess an acceptable proof of vaccination;*
4. *Present a **negative** RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (48) hours or a negative laboratory-based Antigen Test taken within twenty-four (24) hours, prior to the date and time of departure from the country of origin/first port of embarkation in a continuous travel to the Philippines, excluding lay-overs;*
5. *Have passports valid for a period of at least six (6) months at the time of their arrival to the Philippines; and*
6. *Obtain, prior to arrival, a travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment*

*costs from reputable insurance providers, with a minimum coverage of USD35,000.00 for the duration of their stay in the Philippines.*

**Q: Are Taiwan nationals required to present an Entry Exemption Document (EED) to be admitted to the Philippines?**

*A: Beginning 0001H, 01 April 2022, Taiwan nationals need not possess an EED to be able to travel to the Philippines, as long as they comply with all the requirements provided above. However, if Taiwan nationals intend to travel to the Philippines **before 01 April 2022**, they should be able to present an EED upon entry or be exempted to do so (e.g. immediate families of Philippine citizens).*

**Q: Are Taiwan nationals required to undergo quarantine once admitted into the Philippines?**

*A: Beginning 0001H, 01 April 2022, Taiwan nationals are no longer required to undergo facility-based quarantine. They shall, however, self-monitor for any sign or symptom for seven (7) days with the first day*

being the date of arrival. Should they experience any symptom, they are required to report this to the local government unit (LGU) of their destination.

**Q: When can a foreign national be considered as fully vaccinated?**

A: Foreign travelers to the Philippines shall be considered fully vaccinated only if s/he can show compliance to the following requisites:

1. Received the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) dose in a 2-dose series vaccine or a single dose vaccine more than fourteen (14) days prior to the date and time of departure from the country of origin/port of embarkation;
2. The vaccine is included in any of the following:
  - (a) [Emergency Use Authorization \(EUA\) List](#) or Compassionate Special Permit (CSP) issued by the Philippine Food and Drug Administration; OR
  - (b) [Emergency Use Listing of the World Health Organization](#).

**Q: What are the acceptable proofs of vaccination for travel to the Philippines?**

A: The following are acceptable proofs of vaccination for travel to the Philippines:

1. WHO International Certificate of Vaccination or Prophylaxis;
2. VaxCertPH;
3. National or state digital certificate of the country/foreign government which has accepted VaxCertPH under a reciprocal arrangement; OR
4. Other proof of vaccination permitted by IATF.

**Q: Are vaccination certificates issued by Taiwan accepted in the Philippines as proof of vaccination?**

A: Yes. In its 164<sup>th</sup> Inter-Agency Task Force Meeting, the IATF resolved to accept and recognize vaccination certificates issued by Taiwan. Thus, Taiwan government-sanctioned vaccination certificates issued by Taiwan hospitals, Taiwan's International Certificate of Vaccination or Prophylaxis, and the Taiwan CDC's digital vaccination certificate are acceptable as proof of vaccination for travel to the Philippines.

**Q: I am a Taiwan national traveling with an 11-year old daughter. Should my daughter be fully vaccinated to be allowed entry into the Philippines?**

A: No. Your daughter need not be fully vaccinated to be allowed entry into the Philippines. She will be admitted as long as you, as her traveling companion, are fully vaccinated.

**Q: I am a Taiwan passport holder and I intend to travel to the Philippines sometime after 01 April 2022. Can I buy the required travel insurance at the NAIA?**

A: No. The travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment costs should be obtained prior to arrival.

**Q: I already bought a travel insurance as required. The insurance covers a one-week stay in the Philippines. However, I intend to travel around the Philippines for two (2) weeks. Will there be issues on this?**

A: Yes. The travel insurance should cover the foreign traveler's entire stay in the Philippines.

## 入境菲律賓的必備條件

依菲律賓「新興傳染病管理跨部會工作小組 (IATF)」2022 年 3 月 24 日之 165 號決議案

**Q: I will be traveling to the Philippines from Taiwan via Singapore. During my lay-over in Singapore, I plan to meet up with a friend somewhere in the city, outside Chiangi Airport. Do I need to take another RT-PCR/Antigen test in Singapore for my travel to the Philippines?**

*A: Yes. When, during a lay-over, the foreign traveler leaves the airport premises or was admitted into another country, his or her continuous travel to the Philippines is deemed to have been broken. S/he shall need to take another RT-PCR test or a laboratory-based Antigen Test in Singapore and present the negative result to be allowed entry into the Philippines.*

**Q: I am not fully vaccinated due to health/medical reasons. My doctor has issued a medical certificate to confirm this. Can I travel to the Philippines?**

*A: No. Only fully vaccinated foreign nationals holding sufficient proof of vaccination shall be admitted to the Philippines.*

**Q: I want to travel to the Philippines but I may not be able to comply with all the travel requirements. Will I have problems when I decide to push through with my travel despite non-compliance with the requirements?**

*A: Yes. Foreign nationals who fail to comply with the travel requirements discussed above shall be denied admission into the Philippines and shall be subjected to exclusion proceedings.*

**Q: 2022 年 4 月 1 日後入境菲律賓的相關條件?**

A: 從 2022 年 4 月 1 日 0:01 起, 外國觀光客, 包括持中華民國臺灣護照者, 不需再向菲律賓外交部申請核發入境許可函, 僅需備妥下列文件, 即可入境:

1. 有效的簽證(例:持 9A 旅遊簽證)
2. 完整接受疫苗接種, 若家長已完整接種疫苗, 則同行的 12 歲以下未成年人可入境
3. 持有有效的疫苗接種證明
4. 持表定航班前 48 小時內陰性核酸檢驗報告 或 (醫療實驗室開立之 24 小時內抗原檢驗報告)原則以第一段表定航班時間起算 48 小時內之檢驗報告為準, **不包含轉機**
5. 持有效且效期大於六個月的護照入境
6. 在出發前向信譽良好的保險公司購買旅遊醫療保險, 保額需大於美金 35000 元, 保險期間需涵蓋您在菲律賓停留的時間

**Q:台灣人需要持有入境豁免文件方可前往菲律賓?**

A:從 2022 年 4 月 1 日 0 時 01 分起, 台灣人不用再向菲律賓外交申請核發入境許可函, 便可入境菲律賓, 只需持前項所述必備文件且遵守相關規定即可。若您仍須在 2022 年 4 月 1 日前入境, 則需持該許可函或依菲律賓政府規定得以免除 (例:直系親屬為菲律賓公民)

**Q: 台灣人入境後需隔離檢疫?**

A: 自 2022 年 4 月 1 日 0 時 01 分起，台灣人入境菲律賓後，不需再於政府指定的場所(檢疫所、飯店)進行隔離。僅需自入境日起進行七日自我健康管理，注意身體是否有症狀或不適，若有症狀，請盡速通報當地政府機關(LGU)您的所在地

**Q:何謂外國人完整接受疫苗注射?**

A: 1.於表定啟程日期前 14 日，按廠牌完整施打兩劑或一劑疫苗

2.疫苗廠牌如下 a) 按菲律賓食品藥物管理局依疫苗緊急使用授權 EUA 或 CSP 表列廠牌

b) 按世界衛生組織緊急使用清單中之廠牌

**Q:持有哪些疫苗接種證明可以前往菲律賓?**

A: 1.世界衛生組織的疫苗接種證明或預防接種證明書

2. VaxCertPH

3. 依互惠原則，採認菲律賓 VaxCertPH 的外國政府機構核發之數位證明

4. 新興傳染病管理跨部會工作小組(IATF)認可的證明文件

**Q: 菲律賓採認台灣的 COVID19 疫苗接種紀錄卡嗎?**

A: 是的，根據菲律賓新興傳染病管理跨部會工作小組(IATF)第 164 次會議決議，承認台灣開立的疫苗接種證書。因此，經由衛福部認可的醫療院所開立的疫苗接種證明、台灣的國際疫苗接種卡、預防接種證

明書和疾管署的 COVID19 數位證明 皆可作為前往菲律賓的疫苗接種證明使用。

**Q: 我是台灣人，有 11 歲的女兒同行，請問我的女兒需要完整接種疫苗方可入境菲律賓嗎?**

A: 您的女兒無需完整接種疫苗，只要作為陪同人的您已完整接種疫苗即可

**Q: 我持有台灣護照，想在 2022 年 4 月 1 日後去菲律賓，請問我可以在菲律賓的艾奎諾國際機場購買旅遊醫療保險嗎?**

A:不可以。COVID19 醫療費用的旅遊醫療保險需在抵達菲律賓前就購買妥當

**Q: 我已經按規定購買旅遊醫療保險，保險效期為在菲律賓停留的一星期時間。但是，我打算在菲律賓旅行兩 (2) 個星期，這會不會有問題?**

A: 會有問題，旅遊保險應涵蓋外國人在菲律賓的整個旅程

**Q: 我將從台灣經新加坡前往菲律賓。在新加坡停留期間，我計劃在樟宜機場外的某個地方與一位朋友見面。我是否需要在新加坡進行另一次 RT-PCR/抗原檢測才能前往菲律賓?**

A: 是的。當在中轉期間，外國旅客離開機場或入境另一個國家，他或她到菲律賓的旅程被視為已中斷。她/他需要在新加坡進行另一次 RT-PCR 測試或實驗室的抗原測試，並出示陰性結果才能入境菲律賓

**Q:** 我想去菲律賓旅行，但我可能無法合乎所有入境條件。儘管不符合規定，但我仍執意前往，請問旅行時會遇到問題嗎？

**A:** 是的，不符合上述入境條件的外國國民將無法進入菲律賓，並被安排搭乘最速航班遣返回台。
